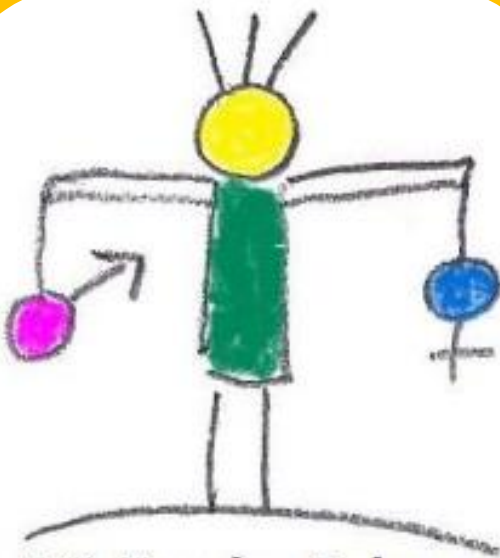


Gender Balance in ECEC Special Interest Group Newsletter

Recently Published:

The SIG updated the publication lists for 2020-2022 and added several articles, including contributions in other languages than English from Denmark, Germany, Italy, Norway, Poland, and especially Brazil. In Brazil, two scientific journals have recently published themed issues on men in early childhood education. The topic of men working in the early years is discussed in more than 30 contributions from a wide range of perspectives. The material includes overview papers as well as theoretical reflections and case studies. One review on academic production on the topic in Brazil found 17 dissertations and one thesis in the years 2018-2021! The texts are mostly in Portuguese, but have abstracts in English language, and all papers are available online.

News from Norway

Queen Maud's College in Trondheim, Norway has for many years focused on recruiting men for ECEC teacher training. This year, one in four new students is male. In a BA program with focus on nature and outdoor play even 37% of new beginners are men. Instead of focusing recruitment campaign only on men, the university highlights diversity, and includes both men and women as representative on fairs, at schools and in PR images. At university, various measures support the retention of men in the training.
